RE: Southern Nevada Health District Weekly COVID-19 response Update

The following is a summary of recent developments in response to COVID-19:

- A post-spring break free community testing drive-through event is planned for Wednesday, April 7, at Allegiant Stadium. This event is for all but designed for any individual who traveled or hosted out-of-town visitors and may be at greater risk of exposure to COVID-19 and its variant strains. Please distribute the attached informational flyer as needed.
- On Tuesday, April 6, the SNHD Food Handler Safety Training Card program will reopen for first-time and renewing clients as well as those needing duplicate or replacement cards. An appointment is required and may be made beginning Friday, April 2, through the Health District's online scheduling system found at <https://www.southernnevadahealthdistrict.org/>. Due to the recent closure, first-time Food Handler Safety Training Card applicants, renewing clients regardless of the expiration date, and those needing duplicate Food Handler Safety Training Cards are able to work until June 30, 2021.
- On Friday, April 2, the CDC updated international travel guidelines. If a person is fully vaccinated with an FDA-authorized vaccine:
 - They should continue to follow CDC's recommendations for traveling safely and get tested 3-5 days after travel.
 - They do NOT need to get tested before leaving the United States unless their destination requires it.
 - They do NOT need to self-quarantine after arriving in the United States.
- Vaccine updates for first and second doses are frequently posted to the Health District's website. Current information is highly accurate, and it is recommended to be reviewed for all questions. Appointments are required <https://covid.southernnevadahealthdistrict.org/vaccine/>
 - A state-wide centralized call center/helpline for all COVID vaccinations will provide information and schedule/cancel appointments. **1-800-401-0946**
 - On April 5th, vaccinations will be open for all eligible individuals.
 - The Health District has established post-vaccine surveillance for cases that occur after the second dose of vaccine is administered. This variable is now part of the case investigation and may help to identify COVID-19 variant strains.

 - Please contact any pharmacy directly for information on vaccinations as their eligibility may differ.



- Vaccine services for Senior Citizens and Homebound persons:
 - People who are homebound, including those needing medical equipment to leave their home such as a wheelchair, a walker or crutches, or are bedridden, can call **702-455-0696** or email homeboundvaccine@clarkcountynv.gov to schedule services. The Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) vaccine will be administered through this program, and participants must be 18 years of age or older.
 - A joint transit project with RTC and the IMT is now available. Any senior community or living facility can arrange a bus to transport seniors to Cashman for vaccinations. The area needs to be able to accommodate a 60-passenger bus. The seniors only have to get on the bus. When they arrive at the vaccination site, everything will be done on the bus, and the seniors won't even have to leave their seats.
